As part of our bespoke curriculum here at Albright Education Centre, we endeavour to plan and deliver a broad, informative and engaging range of subjects to allow your child to thrive.

One area that we value as hugely important in the development of young people is our PSHE curriculum. Personal, social, health and economic (PSHE) education is an important and necessary part of all pupils' education. All schools are required to teach PSHE as part of the national curriculum.

PSHE is a non-statutory subject, so we have room to personalise the curriculum to our learners needs. PSHE can encompass many areas of study and we are best placed to understand the needs of our pupils in our centre and from our local community.

At Albright, we use the PSHE education programme to equip pupils with a sound understanding of risk and with the knowledge and skills necessary to make safe and informed decisions.

There is statutory content that we are required to deliver in schools, specifically on drug education, financial education, Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) and the importance of physical activity and diet for a healthy lifestyle. These topics are delivered through our PSHE programme as well as in other areas of the school curriculum.
