




The Journey so far!


To raise Basquiat's profile and keep him as a talking point throughout the month Miss Mclean set up a scavenger hunt using his trademark crown for stu-

Frank Chapman Residentia








The students really enjoyed the day, it was nice to see so many of the students having fun outside of the class room and celebrating the magic of Christmas together.

Panto - Beauty and the Beast


